Proofreading and Editing

Remember, with any writing you do, please proofread and edit your writing.

<u>Proofreading</u> - Checking to make sure there are no spelling mistakes and then using a dictionary to check/correct them. Checking to make sure you are using the correct punctuation.


Editing - Reading through your writing and making changes to make it more interesting. This could be taking out information or adding in information. It could also be rearranging your writing to make it more clear.

A review is written to give us a person's opinion about a range of products as well as services. Can you and someone in your bubble discuss and list the different reviews we can write?

REVIEWS

Your job is to choose a product or service to write a review for. Please refer to the guide on this slide to help order your writing.

Please remember to go back and proofread/edit your writing to ensure it makes sense.

REVIEW GUIDE

First paragraph - Explain the product/service and what its purpose is. If it's a book, tell us a little bit about it (but not giving the whole story away) Second Paragraph - Explain what you enjoyed about the product/service/book and why.

<u>Third Paragraph</u> - Explain what you didn't enjoyed or could be improved. <u>Final Paragraph</u> - Explain who would benefit from this product/service the most and why. You could also rate it out of 5 stars and explain why you gave it these stars.

Mapping Instructions

For this task you will need: 1 buddy from your bubble

Can you guide a person in your bubble to a specific point in your house if they are wearing a blindfold?

Your task is to create a set of instructions to guide a bubble buddy from one point in the house to another.

Your instructions must:

- Include a title
- Use time connectives (First, next, then)
- Have simple and clear steps
- Have an obstacle to guide your chosen bubble buddy around (if you choose stairs, make sure to be extra careful)
- Stay inside of your house



Once you have completed your set of instructions, pick a buddy, blindfold them and film them being guided by you and following your instructions.

There are many different items around the house that you can use as a blindfold - Miss Fordham used a pair of socks to blindfold her bubble buddy! Here is an example set of instructions that were used to guide a bubble buddy from the lounge to the kitchen. Use this to help guide your set of instructions.

How to get from the lounge to the kitchen.

- 1. First, take 3 steps forward.
- 2. Then, take a 90 degree turn to the left. You are now at the top of the stairs, put your left hand out and grab hold of the railing.
- 3. Walking carefully and slowly, take 7 steps down. Turn 90 degrees to the left and continue walking for 3 steps. Again, turn 90 degrees to the left and walk down 7 steps. You are now at the bottom of the stairs.
- 4. Next, turn 90 degrees to the left and take 3 steps forward.
- 5. Then, turn 90 degrees to the right, put your right hand out and open the door.
- 6. Finally, take 2 big steps forward. You are now in the kitchen.
