BOARD ELECTIONS ARE COMING

...but, what does it mean to be 'on the Board?'

The NZ School Board Elections are set for September 10, and as a school community, we will have the opportunity to vote in the parent representatives for our school board's next three year term.

Let's talk details...

- What is a school board?
- Who are its members?
- What exactly do they do?

This special board newsletter aims to share insights on boards' responsibilities and the role of a parent representative, and encourage our community to make a nomination or stand for election.

What is a school board?

A school board is a group of people (board members) working together towards common goals to govern their school.

Boards have overall legal responsibility and accountability for the school. Their primary objectives ensure the school is safe for all, inclusive of and caters to students with differing needs and gives effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi.

Responsibilities include:

- Setting the strategic direction for the school
- Protecting the school's values
- Monitoring & evaluating student learning outcomes
- Reviewing & updating governance policies
- Financial stewardship
- Building community engagement and support

Boards meet monthly, during the school term, and members are required to review documentation in advance for discussion and decision-making.

It may sound like a lot of mahi, but it's a team effort and there is a variety of support available.

GOVERNANCE VS. MANAGEMENT

The board's role is to govern the school by setting strategic goals and policies by which the school is controlled and managed.

The board entrusts the principal to handle the day-to-day management of the school, guided by the board's policies and working towards the strategic goals.

Governance / The Board determines:

THE WHAT Designing the future

THE ENDS The outcomes to be achieved

• **THE POLICIES** Statements of what is expected

Management / The Principal determines:

• **THE HOW** Designing how to get there

THE MEANS Strategies to achieve the ends

• THE PROCEDURES Steps to meet expectations



Who can become a Parent Rep?

Almost anyone in the community can be a board member! Ideally, board members will bring a diverse mix of perspectives, skills and representation of our school's community.

You don't need to be a parent of a MENPS student, though you must be nominated by someone who is on the school's electoral roll.

What skills do you need?

People often think board members need to have a legal or business background, but that is not the case! It doesn't matter what you do – it matters that you care about education in your community and you want to make a difference.

Valuable skills are:

- Work well as part of a team
- Not afraid to ask challenging questions
- Have good communication skills
- Be connected to the school community

Why join the board?

Becoming a parent representative brings members great responsibility and even greater reward.

This fulfilling and sometimes challenging role offers an incredible learning experience and a truly meaningful opportunity to give back to our school community and our children, who are at the heart of everything we do.
